



#### TIPS FOR A FUN. SAFE KAYAK FISHING ADVENTURE

Fighing from a kayak is an active way to get close with nature. Kayaks are small, galet and more maneuverable than any other boat. Plus, you can get close to shore where other boaters rely on less accurate, long-distance carding.


- Be a confident paddler. Learn basic paddling strokes and how to self-rescue. Hands-on instruction and online paddling safety courses are available.
- Leave your packed tackle box home. Bring only basic tackle for the specific fish species you are trying to catch.
- Check water levels and weather conditions. Never paddle when lightning is in the area.
  Be safe. Fish with a buddy and let someone know where
- you're going. Wear a properly-fitted life jacket and bring a first aid kit. Carry a cell phone in a watertight dry-bag for emergencies.
- Tie down your paddle, tackle box and other fishing necessities to avoid losing them.
- Biring plenty of water. Wher light, loose (fitting clothing that dries quickly, Wher a hart, sunglisses and plenty of sunscreen.
   Stay well downstream and upstream of low-head dams. Use castion fishing around wood detris listrainen) on outside bends of streams and rivers. Se careful padding around obstructions such as snags, log jams, submerged logs and other debris.

#### CLEAN, DRAIN, DRY,

You can help stop the spread of aquatic invasive species by following these easy steps everytime you explore losss waters.

- CLEAN: When you get your kayak out of the water, inspect it to make sure there are no plants, mud or debris on or in it, the paddler, and any equipment or trailer. If you find anything, remove it and dispose of it in the trash or on dry land away from water before moving to a new location.
- DRAPE Make sure there is no standing-water in your keysk. Tip it upside down to make size there lant any water in the bottom. Make sure your bait buckets and internal compartments are clean and dry as well.
- DRY: Use a ray or towel to dry your vessel including all
  competiments, livewells, and belt buckets, as well as your
  anchor of applicable. If possible, dry everything for five or
  more days, Most aquatic invasive species can only survive in
  sert conditions, so this is one of the best ways to help prevent
  their spread.

## **Ready to Kayak Fish**

#### Tips for a Fun, Safe Kayak Fishing Adventure

Fishing from a kayak is an active way to get close with nature. Kayaks are small, quiet and more maneuverable than any other boat. Plus, you can get close to shore where other boaters rely on less accurate, long distance casting.

- Be a confident paddler. Learn basic paddling strokes and how to self-rescue. Hands-on instruction and online paddling safety courses are available.
- Leave your packed tackle box home. Bring only basic tackle for the specific fish species you are trying to catch.
- Check water levels and weather conditions. Never paddle when lighting is in the area.
- Be safe. Fish with a buddy and let someone know where you're going. Wear a properly-fitted life jacket
  and bring a first aid kit. Carry a cell phone in a watertight dry-bag for emergencies.
- Tie down your paddle, tackle box and other fishing necessities to avoid losing them.
- Bring plenty of water. Wear light, loose fitting clothing that dries quickly. Wear a hat, sunglasses and plenty of sunscreen.
- Stay well downstream and upstream of low-head dams. Use caution fishing around wood debris (strainers) on outside bends of streams and rivers. Be careful paddling around obstructions such as snags, log jams, submerged logs and other debris.

#### Clean. Drain. Dry

You can help stop the spread of aquatic invasive species by following these easy steps everytime you explore Iowa waters.

- CLEAN: When you get your kayak out of the water, inspect it to make sure there are no plants, mud or
  debris on or in it, the paddles, and any equipment or trailer. If you find anything, remove it and dispose
  of it in the trash or on dry land away from water before moving to a new location.
- DRAIN: Make sure there is no standing water in your kayak. Tip it upside down to make sure there isn't
  any water in the bottom. Make sure your bait buckets and internal compartments are clean and dry as
  well.
- DRY: Use a rag or towel to dry your vessel including all compartments, livewells, and bait buckets, as well
  as your anchor (if applicable). If possible, dry everything for five or more days. Most aquatic invasive
  species can only survive in wet conditions, so this is one of the best ways to help prevent their spread.

#### **Buy Your License Online**

Anyone 16 years and older must have a fishing license to fish Iowa waters.

Yearly, seven-day, or 24-hour fishing licenses are available.





### **Digital Advertising Success**

- Spent \$9,165 (+ \$3,335 fees)
- Ads were optimized towards landing page activity
- Reached 178,231 people, generated 1,769,671 impressions, and 4,075 link clicks



# **Digital Advertising Success**




As an additional bonus to the campaign, users that saw the ads generated 3,214 license system transactions, which generated \$114,180 in license system revenue, for \$2.85 cost per purchase and a 15.67 Return On Ad Spend (ROAS).



### Sign-Ups by Month



### **Lessons Learned**



### RBFF funding helped Iowa DNR:

- Build a database of recreational paddlers
  - Of the 1514 who signed up for the passport,
     785 opted in to receive occasional emails
     from the Iowa DNR.

### **Future Plans**



- Survey 2022 passport holders to learn more about why they signed up, if they actively participated, any barriers, and suggestions for improving their passport experience.
- Refresh the Hook n' Paddle Passport to build a sense of community among female recreational paddlers.

## Refresh the Hook n' Paddle Passport

- Add additional sites with women-friendly amenities like restrooms and easy access
- Refresh the imagery and content of the landing webpage and digital ads to be female-focused
- Increase frequency of in-feed messages, emails and texts

# Refresh the Hook n' Paddle Passport

- New prize system with a variety of ways to earn points and redeem for women-focused incentives
- Launch in early May to encourage participation during women and family-focused holidays
- Expand women-focused programming opportunities to build social support communities
