- Second most urbanized state


Challenges:

- Small population = competing for relevancy

- Travel barriers

- USFWS coordinated, volunteers, staff, fishing activities and fish from National fish hatchery





Brief History of DOEE's MFCC

When

 Donation discussions began in late 2020, completed trailer delivered and operational by mid-April 2021

Why

• RBFF had additional funding following initial trailer rollout in ~10 states; District of Columbia fit the bill as a textbook urban fishery

How

 Worked directly with RBFF, regional trailer distributor, DOEE's Office of Communications, Engagement, and Outreach (OCEO), and a graphics specialist to coordinate purchase, custom wrapping, and pick-up of MFCC trailer



Benefits

In one word, the MFCC has been a **gamechanger** for our angling education program. How?

- Modular, rapidly deployable, with all necessary tackle and equipment in one consolidated location
 - RBFF provided us with the specific equipment we needed
- RBFF worked with DOEE to ensure trailer wrap/graphics are representative of the community they serve
- MFCC's all-encompassing nature makes collaborative events even more appealing to prospective partner organizations, <u>allowing our</u> small staff to scale our reach considerably



Creating Partnerships

- Non-profit and federal/local government partners are often eager to collaborate, but lack necessary gear and know-how
 - MFCC helps cement new partnerships, bridging the gap between partner organizations which may lack gear and know-how, and our team, which has limited staffing capabilities
- Planning phase begins in early Q2
 - We reach out to past and potential new partners, securing weekend fishing dates on a first-come, first-served basis
 - 4-to-6-month lead time allows for necessary planning, permitting, and promotion
 - Majority of events occur in Q3 and Q4 (Apr. Sept.)

Noteworthy Partnerships

DOEE, in partnership with NPF, NPS, and NPT, hosted two *Junior Ranger ASL Angler* events at the Tidal Basin during National Fishing and Boating Week 2022. Staff and volunteers provided fishing instruction, via ASL translators, to members of the local Deaf Community.

These <u>first-of-their-kind</u> events were so popular that we hosted an additional event in September 2022. One attendee caught a 21lb blue catfish at the September event!





Noteworthy Partnerships (cont.)

DOEE partnered with MPD's Criminal Apprehension Unit to provide spring and fall fishing trips for local public charter school students at MPD's Harbor Patrol HQ. Code 3 Association generously provided lunch for both outings.

One student caught an 18lb blue catfish during our fall trip!








Noteworthy Partnerships (cont.)




